Records Atchison, Kansas, Senior High School indicate WILLIAM WINSTON COCHRANE, Jr., born October 11, 1912; graduated June 1930; grades average; entered University of Kansas September 1930; receiving BS degree August 1934; grades average; one failure Income Tax Procedure, not required course, which subsequently permitted drop. Student Accounting Instructor two semesters. Graduate work February 1935 to June 1935, grades slightly below B; entered Law School same institution September 1936, graduating August 1939, LLB degree. Admitted Kansas Bar June 22, 1939; now member in good standing; unable locate record suit against APPLICANT while manager Kansas University Memorial Building. University professors, associates and others state COCHRANE of good character, reputation, sober habits, good personality and is intelligent. All recommend for position sought. All former employers speak of Applicant in highest terms and recommend. References and neighborhood investigation reflect Applicant of good family; Applicant highly regarded in community now living and in which has lived. Credit rating located Lawrence, Ks., only, which is good. No criminal record. Member Delta Tau Delta Fraternity. Popular with students and faculty. Applicant self-supporting student throughout entire period at University, having been employed at University and other places in Lawrence. Takes occasional high-ball at social functions; does not drink to excess. Father and mother residing Kansas City, Mo.; presently are managing an apartment house. Applicant single. Religion Baptist.

DETAILS:

AT ATCHISON, KANSAS

At the Atchison Senior High School it was ascertained that WILLIAM COCHRANE entered this school in September 1927; graduated in June 1930 with average grades; the date of Applicant's birth as shown from the records of this school is given as October 11, 1912. Applicant did not participate in athletics to any extent as he was working all the time he was in school. There is no record of disciplinary action against Applicant while attending high school.

REX H. A. DAVIS, teacher at Atchison Senior High School, was interviewed by the writer and he stated that COCHRANE was a very good student while under him for a period of two years, and that he was a boy of sober habits and unquestionable character so far as known to him. He stated that his school work was very satisfactory and to his knowledge COCHRANE did not skip school nor was he out sick.

Miss JANE HOLM, 221 North 3rd Street, states Applicant was in her class for a period of two years and that to her knowledge he was of unquestionable character, and she knows of no derogatory information regarding him whatsoever.

Mr. JOSEPH W. CONNOR, E. R. #2, Rushville, Mo. (adjacent to Atchison) states WILLIAM COCHRANE, Jr. was employed as a counter man at his concession at Sugar Lake during his summer vacation of the years 1927, 1928 and 1929, and received a salary of approximately forty cents (40¢) per hour; that to his knowledge, COCHRANE was a very willing worker and enjoyed a good reputation in that community during the time he worked for him. He stated he has not been in contact recently with COCHRANE and could give no information regarding recent years of his life.

It was learned in Atchison that Reverend C. K. DAVIS of Atchison, Kansas, named by Applicant as a reference, is now at 926 South Cline Street, Aberdeen, South Dakota. An appropriate teletype has been dispatched to Aberdeen requesting that the Aberdeen Office conduct an interview with Reverend DAVIS.

Mr. PAUL ALLINGHAM, business manager of the Atchison Daily Globe states Applicant was employed by him while a small boy carrying papers in Atchison, and that to his knowledge, Applicant was very loyal to the newspaper; for instance, he would return after delivering his papers in the evening to see if anyone on his route had failed to receive their paper and if so, he would personally deliver them a copy. This, he stated, was not the ordinary procedure for paper carriers in Atchison. Mr. ALLINGHAM has not been in close touch with COCHRANE during the past few years, but stated that his family is one that is very well thought of in Atchison.

Mr. JOHN KAFF, who resides at 1030 North 5th Street, was interviewed at the Kaff Drug Store, and he states COCHRANE was employed by him during the summer of 1931 as a fountain clerk; that his services were entirely satisfactory and he was well liked by all his customers and his, COCHRANE'S, associates. Mr. KAFF stated that he has known the COCHRANE family for several years and they enjoy a good reputation in Atchison and that the entire family is well thought of. He states that to his knowledge none of them has ever been in any trouble or has ever been arrested.

GLENN G. GERARD, stated by Applicant to be residing in Atchison, Kansas, was found to be now residing at 2406 Duncan Street, St. Joseph, Missouri. Mr. GERARD states he has known COCHRANE for several years and that he was employed by him as a waiter from December 1928 to August 1930 in a restaurant in Atchison, Kansas. He stated that COCHRANE was a hard worker and that he was honest, intelligent, and to his knowledge did not drink. He further stated that COCHRANE has a pleasing personality and was polite with the customers patronizing this restaurant.

AT LAWRENCE, KANSAS

At the University of Kansas, Miss MAE RUBLEE, Secretary to the Registrar, produced records indicating that Applicant COCHRANE entered the University on September 13, 1930, and graduated in August 1939. He obtained his BS degree on August 8, 1934, with average grades. This record showed a failure in Income Tax Procedure in the spring term of 1934, and Miss RUBLEE informed that this was not a required course, and that COCHRANE was excused by the Dean from taking same on 9-10-1934. From February to June 1935, COCHRANE pursued graduate work under Dean STAUFER, with grades averaging slightly below B. (Dean STAUFER was not available for interview at the time of Agent's visit.) From September 1936 to August 1939, COCHRANE attended the Kansas University Law School, graduating in August 1939, with an LLB degree. His grades in this course were average, slightly below B.

Miss RUBLEE was not personally acquainted with Applicant, therefore, she referred the writer to Mr. CHARLES MC CREIGHT.

Mr. CHARLES MC CREIGHT, 1303 Vermont Street, who is presently in charge of student activities at the University stated that he has known COCHRANE for five or six years, and that COCHRANE had submitted daily financial statements to him while he was manager of the Kansas Memorial Union Building; that he was scrupulously honest, and that the budget of this building was balanced during the year COCHRANE was head of same; that being manager of this Union Building required considerable tact, diplomacy and was quite a responsible position. He states that Applicant COCHRANE did not drink to his knowledge; that he was conservative in his speech and was interested in athletics, but did not participate personally in them, due to his working activities while attending the University. MC CREIGHT states that he does not recall any suit being brought against the Kansas University Memorial Building in the Justice of the Peace Court at Lawrence, while COCHRANE was head of the same.

Mr. JOHN G. BLOCKER, Accounting Professor in the School of Business, stated that COCHRANE had worked under him as a Student Accounting Instructor for two semesters after graduating in accountancy, and that he has known him for six years and has the highest regard for his ability in handling students and instructing in accounting. He did not recall exact dates COCHRANE worked for him, but thought it was around in 1934 or 1935. Mr. BLOCKER had no information regarding suit against COCHRANE while head of the Union Building, but stated that it might possibly have been a suit brought by one of the negro students due to an assignment of the seating arrangement in the cafeteria of this building. He further stated that COCHRANE was honest, capable, intelligent and sincere in the performance of all his duties at the University. Mr. BLOCKER recommended COCHRANE for the position sought. Mr. BLOCKER was acquainted with COCHRANE both in school and socially having attended many of the social functions of the fraternity of which COCHRANE is a member. He stated that COCHRANE did not drink to excess, though he occasionally partook of a highball at social functions. Mr. BLOCKER advised that COCHRANE is presently the Assistant Chapter Adviser in the Delta Tau Delta Fraternity, and that he received board and room when acting as adviser to students in the fraternity house after his graduation.

F. T. STOCKTON, Dean, University of Kansas, given as a reference by Applicant, states he has known Applicant for eight years; that he is ambitious; has good ability, initiative, good business judgment and that he had served one or two semesters as Student Accounting Instructor, under Mr. BLOCKER, hereinabove referred to, and that his character and reputation were completely satisfactory; that he did not drink or use profane language to his knowledge; that he was neat, conservative, and had good executive ability. Dean STOCKTON further stated that he had recommended other students at this University for the position of Special Agent with this Bureau and had recommended some unfavorably, who were not employed by the Bureau; and stated that he recommends COCHRANE very highly; that he believes COCHRANE'S ability superior to other students whom he has highly recommended.

Dean STOCKTON has no knowledge of a suit brought against COCHRANE while head of the Union Memorial Building and stated that he had been 100% self-supporting during his entire attendance at this University. Dean STOCKTON advised that Applicant did good work in his law classes and that he thought that COCHRANE would make a good attorney.

Mr. ROBERT RIEDERER, 1147 Tennessee Street, stated that he had been in the same fraternity with COCHRANE and has known him four and one-half years, having lived with him two years while attending the University Medical School. He recommends COCHRANE highly for the position sought and further stated that COCHRANE was very reliable and generally well liked by every one; that he has a quiet and polite disposition and was of good moral character.

Mr. LEONARD AXE, 118 West Administration Building, or 2113 New Hampshire Avenue, states that he has been personally acquainted with COCHRANE for five or six years, having attended the University with him and also attending social functions with Applicant. He recommends COCHRANE highly for the position sought, stating that COCHRANE is honest, intelligent and ambitious; that to his knowledge, he has had no disciplinary action brought against him while in the University and has never gotten into any trouble at the University.

Mr. J. F. KING, 1100 Ohio, states that he had worked with COCHRANE while he was manager of the Union Building, and that he has been personally acquainted with him for several years, having known him in both business and social circles. He stated that Applicant did not partake of intoxicants to his knowledge, but if he did he thought it would be very moderately, and he recommends COCHRANE for the position sought.

Mr. RAY CHILDS, Men's University Club, 1435 Ohio, advised that he has known COCHRANE for four or five years and that he has remarkable ability in meeting and getting along with people, inasmuch as his position at the University required a technique of this type. He advised that COCHRANE would occasionally take a drink, but had

never drank to excess to his knowledge and had never been in any trouble at the University and was polite and well liked by all. He recommends COCHRANE for position sought.

Miss HERNIE ZIPPELL, present manager of the University Memorial Building, stated that she has known Applicant for the past year only and that she knew of no derogatory information regarding him. She recommends him for the position sought.

Mrs. C. H. LANDIS, presently operating the fraternity house at 1111 West 11th Street, advises that she has known Applicant for five years and that he is honest, intelligent, of sober habits, reserved and recommends COCHRANE for the position he is seeking.

All others who were residing at Applicant's fraternity house with COCHRANE are no longer there.

GEORGE DOCKING, Vice-president of the First National Bank, given as reference by Applicant states that he has known COCHRANE for the last six years while COCHRANE was attending the University and that he is well liked by all, is neat in his appearance and enjoys a good reputation in that vicinity. He advised that COCHRANE balanced the budget at the Union Memorial Building during his period of leadership, and that this was quite unusual. He further advised that COCHRANE had been offered several positions that he knew of, but stated that they were probably not the type of employment he desired. He further stated that COCHRANE did not drink to his knowledge, and that he took pleasure in recommending him for the position sought, advising that he fully appreciated the qualifications and type of individuals sought by the Bureau.

Mr. CHARLES C. LONG, proprietor of the Blue Mills Sandwich Shop, 1009 Massachusetts, advised that COCHRANE worked for him for approximately four years and stated that the dates given by COCHRANE were about as accurate as he could give, namely, February to June 1931 and September 1932 to February 1934. COCHRANE'S position while with Mr. LONG was that of waiter and his salary during this time was approximately \$10.00 a week, outside of board, excluding tips. He

stated that COCHRANE drank occasionally, but never drank to excess to his knowledge; that he was a very quiet and conscientious worker; was conservative in his speech and that he was honest and intelligent.

Mr. CORLIFF J. COTTON, Secretary to the Men's University Club, 1435 Ohio, stated that COCHRANE worked for him for his board and room at the University Club during the past year, the exact dates of which he could not recall, and that he had known COCHRANE for a period of five years, including the time of his employment with him. He recommended Applicant for the position sought, stating that he was honest, intelligent, attentive to duty and ambitious.

Mr. HENRY WARNER, 937 Ohio, Adviser to Men at the University, stated that COCHRANE was business manager, cashier and book-keeper of the Kansas University Memorial Union Building from June 5, 1934 to June 7, 1937; that his duties there consisted of having complete charge of the recreation and lunch rooms conducted by this building and that he has known COCHRANE for approximately six years. He advised that COCHRANE'S duties amounted to principally that of public relations officer, and that he was paid a salary of \$75.00 for the first year and \$100.00 monthly beginning the second year. He stated that he would re-employ COCHRANE if the opportunity presented itself inasmuch as COCHRANE has been greatly missed by the students at the University at this Memorial Building due to his efficient operation of same and his ability to please all. He further stated that he came in daily contact with COCHRANE, and that he was a boy of sober habits, was neatly dressed; and recommends him for the position sought. Mr. WARNER stated that COCHRANE had not advised him of this application with the Bureau, and he was surprised to hear of same. He had no record nor could he recall any information regarding suit brought against the Memorial Building in the Justice of the Peace Court at Lawrence while COCHRANE was head of same. He advised that

COCHRANE resigned his position as manager of this Memorial Building to take a position with the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in Kansas City, Missouri.

Records of the Clerk of the Court, Lawrence, Kansas, and also with Justice of the Peace OYLER and Justice of the Peace RANKIN at Lawrence revealed no record regarding suit brought by ALEX PEEBLES. However, Justice of the Peace CHARLES C. RANKIN advised that this suit probably could have been by some of the Lawrence students over activity tickets, which were ordered purchased by everyone by the Students Council. It was his belief that this suit was of this nature and probably was to be a test suit.

Neighborhood investigation at Lawrence, Kansas:

Mr. HARRY T. CRAIG, 1735 Illinois Street, employed in the Business Office at the University, advised that COCHRANE had roomed at his home for nine months during the past school year and that he was of high moral character, honest, intelligent and well liked by all. He advised he had known COCHRANE for four years including the time that he lived with him, and that he never drank to excess nor did he go out on any wild parties. He further advised that COCHRANE'S spare time seemed to be well planned, COCHRANE spending his leisure time in self-improvement rather than foolishly.

Miss MARY LOUISE Mc NOWEN, 1734 Illinois, advised that she was not personally acquainted with COCHRANE, but stated that at no time were there any disturbances at his residence, and that to her knowledge COCHRANE did not drink or get in any trouble.

Mrs. ODY SMITH, 1730 Illinois, advised that she was not closely acquainted with COCHRANE, but that he was well liked by all to her knowledge in this neighborhood. She advised that he did not run around with women and that to her knowledge, no wild parties or disturbances were indulged in by COCHRANE.

Contacts at other homes in this neighborhood failed to find anyone who was acquainted with COCHRANE.

AT KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

Mr. AVIS Mc PIKE, given as reference by COCHRANE, residence 4033 Warwick, owner of the Mc Pike Drug Company, 7th and Central Streets, advised that he has known the Applicant's family for forty-five years and that none of the COCHRANES has ever been in any trouble to his knowledge; altho it was necessary to dismiss COCHRANE'S father, W. W. COCHRANE about nine years ago from their employ due to excessive drinking. However, he stated that at the present time, COCHRANE'S father is not drinking and that he had improved considerably. He could not give any information as to COCHRANE'S character and reputation inasmuch as he was not personally acquainted with young COCHRANE.

Mr. M. W. RUSH, District Operating Manager of the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company, Independence Avenue and Hardesty, advised that Applicant was employed by him in a clerical and accounting capacity in the above company on June 7, 1937 and that he resigned February 1, 1938, having received a salary of \$125.00, monthly. Mr. RUSH stated that he would re-employ COCHRANE if the opportunity presented itself and that Applicant resigned because he thought he should advance more rapidly and desired work that would give him more opportunity of advancement. He further advised that COCHRANE was honest, conservative in his speech, intelligent, neatly dressed and carried himself well.

Mrs. OSCAR SEEBER, 611 Kensington Avenue, given as an employment reference at Parkville, Missouri, was contacted at her home in Kansas City. Mrs. SEEBER advised that she and her husband had owned a summer resort at Sugar Lake, Missouri, and that while owning same, COCHRANE was employed by her as a clerk in the soda fountain and dance hall at Sugar Lake from June to September 1936 and June to September 1937. His salary at this time was \$15.00 a week excluding tips and other incidental sums earned by clerks working for her at the concession. She advised

that COCHRANE is honest, intelligent, of sober habits and of good moral character and that she would re-employ him at the first opportunity if she were in business again.

Mrs. J. S. LINDSAY, Apartment 202, 317 East 48th Street, advised that she has known BILLIE COCHRANE for five years; that he was above the average boy in her estimation and has the best of habits, was of good moral character and was honest and appeared to be intelligent. She advised that Mr. and Mrs. COCHRANE, Applicant's father and mother, who are presently managing this apartment at 317 East 48th Street, enjoyed a good reputation in that community and that they have been managing this apartment building over two years.

Mrs. ROSE HENDERSON, apartment 203, advised that she has known Applicant for three years and that he was to her knowledge a good boy, not causing any disturbances at all in this apartment house, and that he did not partake of intoxicants to her knowledge and was of good moral character.

Mrs. C. M. YAGER, Jr., apartment 201, advised that she has only lived there since April and did not know Applicant very well, having only talked to young COCHRANE a few times, but that he appeared to be intelligent, very well liked and of good habits.

F. M. HARRISON, janitor at the above apartment building, advised that he did not know BILLIE COCHRANE very well, having only talked with him a few times when he was home from school, but that to his knowledge he did not drink and run around with any disreputable companions.

Mrs. JEMILD J. YOUNG, apartment 103, 319 East 48th Street, advised that she had known young COCHRANE for several years and had attended social functions given by the fraternity of which he was a member and that to her knowledge COCHRANE did not drink to excess on any of these occasions and was a gentleman at all times, and that she recommends him for the position sought. She further advised that he is honest, intelligent and very capable of mastering anything which he undertakes.

MARY LOUISE QUIET, 6445 Wornall Terrace, Kansas City, Missouri, advised that she has known WILLIAM COCHRANE, Jr., for three years, having attended Law School with him; that he was of high moral character, honest, intelligent and capable, and that he had not been into any trouble to her knowledge, and that he did not drink to excess.

Inquiry telephonically of Deputy Clerk N. B. THOMPSON of the Kansas Supreme Court at Topeka revealed that WILLIAM WINSTON COCHRANE, Jr. was admitted to the Kansas Bar on June 22, 1939, having taken this examination only one time and is now a member in good standing.

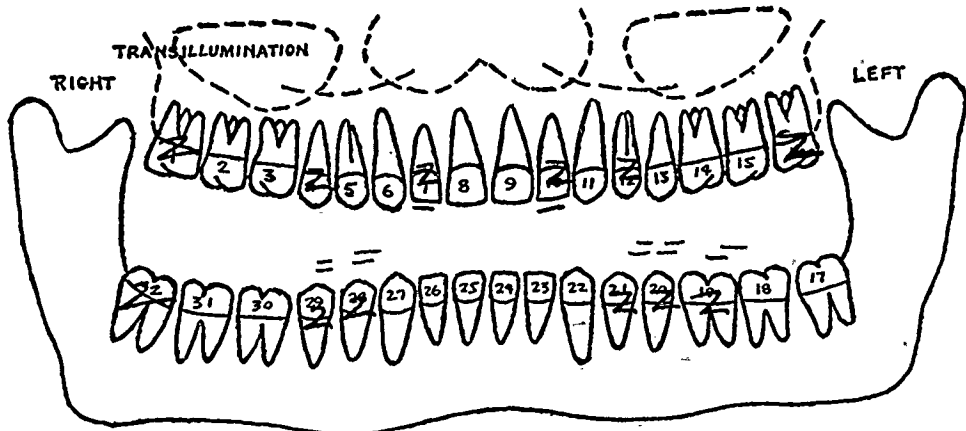



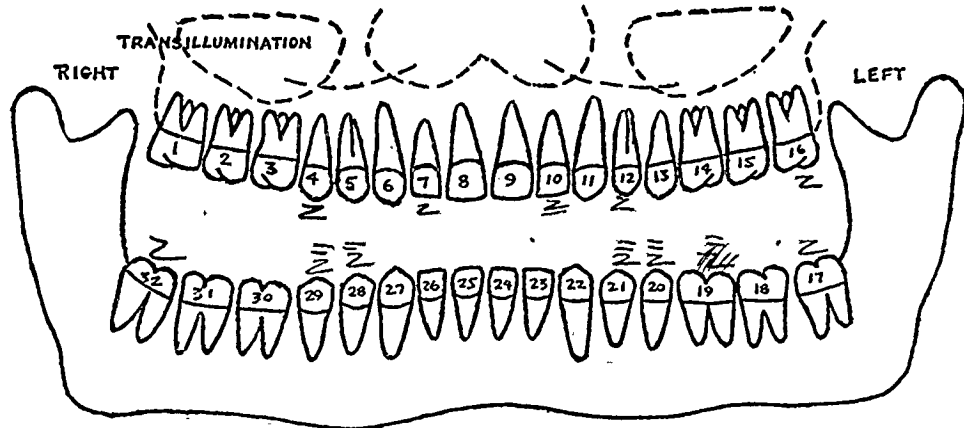

This Agent is presently assigned to the NY Field Office and has been so assigned since February 17, 1941. A review of his file indicates that up to November 1941 his progress was average. However, since that time all reports indicate above average development. He has been handling German work in the NY area and has demonstrated not only above average investigative ability, but also administrative ability.

On July 17, 1942, the NY Office advised that SA Cochrane had handled the preparation of the Government's case against alien enemy members of the German American Vocational League, which resulted in the apprehension of 158 of these enemy alien members on July 10, 1942, in NYC and vicinity. NY states that his preparation of the case, and particularly that with regard to the procedure of apprehension and handling subsequent to apprehension, was outstanding. The NY office advised that these things had clearly demonstrated Cochrane's executive and administrative ability.

On July 2, 1943, Mr. J. K. Mumford recorded a telephone call from Mr. Jerome Simmons of the Special War Policies Unit in connection with the German-American Vocational League case. Among other things, it was stated by Mr. Simmons that Agent Cochrane, who had been working on the case, had been doing fine work and he, therefore, wished to recommend Cochrane very highly.

By memorandum of July 19, 1943, Wendell Berge, Assistant Attorney General in Charge of the Criminal Division, in making reference to the successful conclusion of the George S. Viereck Registration Act case, stated: "The work of SA W. W. Cochrane of the NY Office was of a very high caliber." As you will recall, the Registration Act case against George Sylvester Viereck has been one of the outstanding security cases during this war, as witnessed by the fact that Viereck is a key figure in the seditious conspiracy trial now going on in Washington under the supervision of O. John Rogge in the Department. The work of Agent Cochrane during this case was definitely outstanding.

Eventually the case against the German American Vocational League (Deutsch-Amerikanische Berufsgemeinschaft) went to trial in Newark, New Jersey, and it has now been successfully concluded with convictions of the organization itself and the Recreational Resort which was subsidized by the League totalling \$10,000. In addition, there were actual sentences amounting to 12 years, plus a five year probationary sentence. At the time of imposition of sentence, namely June 2, 1944, the presiding Judge, Honorable Thomas F. Meaney, after pronouncing the actual sentences, made the following comments:

"I would like to speak a word of praise for the FBI. They have been throughout the course of the trial both modest and unassuming and have conducted themselves as people of the U.S. have a right to expect their public servants to conduct themselves, but which is rarely carried out to the extent to which they have carried out their duties during the course of this trial. As to the investigative work, if I am any judge as to how the case was prepared, the convictions were produced largely through their efforts."

It is the feeling of myself and the Supervisors on German matters that the praise received by the Bureau from Judge Heaney is due in no small part to the investigative activities of SA Cochrane, as well as his demeanor during the course of the trial and his assistance in the preparation thereof.

As substantiation of this feeling, Edith Lowenstein, the attorney in the War Division who was assigned to collaborate with the U. S. Attorney in Newark, New Jersey, in the prosecution of this case, wrote the Bureau on June 1, 1944, stating that she had collaborated with Agent Cochrane in the preparation of this case over a period of eight months, which resulted in a deep admiration for his efficiency and conscientiousness. She stated: "I wish to express my thanks to you for assigning him to this case and to him for the excellent work which he has done." She concluded: "Mr. Cochrane contributed very substantially to the success of the case and all of us enjoyed working with him."

Agent Cochrane was recently observed by the writer during In-Service Training and he makes a very splendid personal appearance. It is felt not only by myself, but also by others both in and out of the Bureau who have observed his work, especially in connection with the German American Vocational League case, that he has been doing definitely above average work.

A meritorious raise reflecting the Bureau's appreciation for this outstanding work would, without doubt, serve as a distinct incentive to still better achievements on his part as well as the other Agents. It might also be observed that his ability is such that he should be considered for possibilities of Supervisory training at the Seat of Government some time in the future.

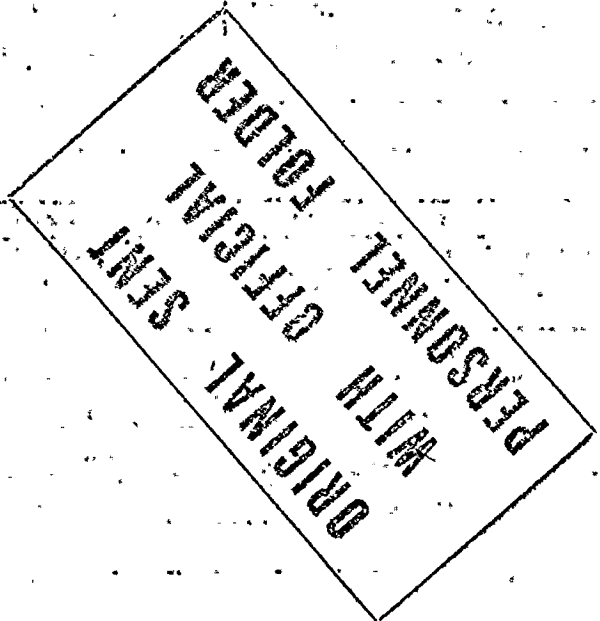
