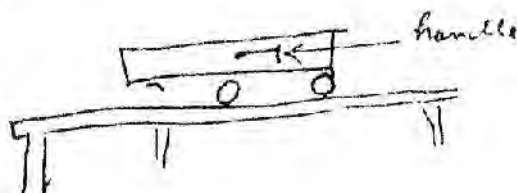

My grandmother Maria Hill, daughter of Lord Hill of Shrewsbury, England, was born Oct. 20, 1791, at Ticknall, Derbyshire, England. I have no account of my grandfather---- My mother Mary Tyrell, a cousin of Tetley, the tea man, was born Jan. 12, 1827 at Derby, England. My father, George Baghurst, was born Jan. 7, 1831, at Ashley-delazonch, England. My father and mother were married 1854 in Derby England. I was

born in Hammonton, New Jersey, U. S. America. Had five sisters, Elizabeth Baghurst born Nov. 13, 1852 by previous wife of George Baghurst, Mary Jane Holmes was born Jan. 16, 1852, by previous marriage of my mother to J. Holmes of Derby, England. --James Baghurst, April 24, 1855, was born in Déby, he died April 9, 1856.--Maria Baghurst was born ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ July 15, 1857, at Derby.--Sarah Baghurst was born at Landport, England Jan. 15, 1859. I was born in Hammonton, N.J., U.S.A., June 20, 1865-- Emma Baghurst was born Sept. 30, 1868, in Derby, England. My father and mother took me to England when I was about 9 months old, and settled in Derby. The first thing that I can remember is when my parents took a store at No. 1 Bridge St., Derby. It formerly was a place where they mangled clothes, i.e. they had a very large Mangle, a machine that smoothed clothes after being washed, and people would send their clothes there to be smoothed & instead of ironing, the mangle was something like this

My grandmother Lady Maria Hill, daughter of Lord Hill & Mary Hill of Shrewsbury, England, was born May, 14, 1771, at Ticknoll, Derbyshire, England, was married to James Laghurst ⁱⁿ Church at Col^eorton Moore in 1813 their first son John was christened 10, 2, 1814, their second child, Maria was born at Col^eorton, Leicestershire, Edward & Mary, James & Emma were christened at Netherseal. His son James was killed in service in the Battle of Sebastopol at Alma, in the 95th Regiment in 1854 after 12 years of service. Benjamin was born at Kethorp and died of a fever before Sebastopol, March, 6, 1855 in capacity of Col. Sargent in H.M. 95th regiment. George was born Jan. 7, 1831 at Donisthorp near Ashley De-Le-Quoch County of Leicester, England and was married in the Zion Chapel at Halifax in Yorkshire to Charlet Walker, she was born at Sadlergate Derby and was christened in St. Michels Church Derby. They had one daughter born on Castle St. Parish of St. Peter, Darby. After her death at no. 8 Arthur St. Derby, George married Mary Tyrrell at Derby, she was the widow of James Holmes and was a cousin of Tetley the tea man and was born Jan. 12, 1827 at Derby, at St. Alburns Parish.

It is said that George frequently talked about one of his brothers who was a high ranking officer in the 95th regiment who's left leg was blown off and who lived to be 106 years old.

Mary sang at Queen Victorias Coronation in the year of 1837. *Aunt Mells Grandmother*

George and Marys first son James, born in All Saints Parish, No. 14, Nuns St Derby, died before he was a year old, Maria was born at Back Parker St. in Derby. Sarah was born at Portsmouth Hants England, then the family moved to Hammonton New Jersey U.S.A. where I, George Abijah was born June 20, 1865. Sarah and George were Christned by Rev. Ownes Nov. 19, 1865 I was 9 months old when my parents moved back to No. 1 Bridge St. Derby, England, where Emma was born. When I was 13 my father sailed for America, landing Feb. 9, 1879.

My Mother died in Clementon, N.J. and was buried in Berlin Cemetery. My father died Nov. 14, 1927 at the home of Maria Eyre in Camden N. J. also our first son George was buried in Berlin Cemetery.
