 City County one certain tract or parcels of land containing three hundred and eighty five acres lying and
 being on both sides of the three Creeks in the County of Surry and bounded as followeth, to wit, beginning
 at a white oak on the north side of the said Creeks thence East by North thirty nine pole to a light wood
 post in George Hamiltons line then by Hamiltons line crossing the Creeks South five degrees East two
 hundred thirty five pole to a red oak then South West by South sixty five pole to a black oak then north
 eighty five degrees West two hundred pole to a hickory then north seventeen degrees West eighty pole to a
 hickory then north twenty degrees East one hundred eighty five pole to a red oak over the three Creeks
 aforesaid just above the mouth of a small branch and down the various courses of the run of the said
